

As the song goes, "It's the most wonderous time of the year!" But before we start to celebrate the peppermint latte's, holiday lights, and the 24 hour a day of the Hallmark channel, I want us to step back, and take a hard look at how we approach this time of year.

The message that many grew up, and are growing up on, Santa Clause is keeping a list, and he knows who is naughty and who is nice! Which list are you on? 'Because who wants a lump of coal in their stocking? As a kid, you spent the holidays terrified that you weren't going to get anything from Santa.

We use all kinds of tricks this time of year to modify our children's behavior, i.e. Elf on a Shelf! Parents, we use Christmas as behavior modification. We have to be in line for Black Friday, and take the morning off for Cyber Monday! I read that the majority of these purchases, aren't gifts, but items we purchase for ourselves! What was once the season of giving, as become a season of "What Did I Get?!" That's not how it started, and it isn't how God wants us to think of this time of the year. In our series last month, I shared how we "Get To" be generous, and how Biblical Generosity begins with us thinking about others first. You may wonder, where did Pastor Mike come up with that idea? Well honestly, it started with a familiar passage often read during this time of year:

For **to us** a child is born, **to us** a son is **given**, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Friends, the Creator of All, thought only of US when he sent the greatest gift of all! This gift came with only one expectation, that WE believe. This gift was sent to not a perfect world, but a broken one, out of love! God isn't checking a list twice to find out who is naughty or nice. God loves us in our naughtiness, so that his love will transform us into our nice!

I know we are coming out of a time where finding the "nice" has been hard, but let's come together this season and prepare ourselves to receive the greatest gift of all, even when we are at our worst, God still chooses to give! Knowing this truth, then yes, it is the most wonderful time of the year!

FAITH COMMUNITY CARE MINISTRY



Tis the Season . . . Football, shopping, celebrations, baking, turkey, family gathering, scheduling, all squeezed between Sundays. During this Advent Season I encourage you to keep Sunday with you to get through your week. I recently was able to participate in a thirty minute "Sit Meditation". It helped me to take a step back and know the peace of God's love. The guided experience first acknowledged where I am in my concerns with the way of the world. A poem was shared, and then the faciilitator explained that we would sit, focus on breath, focus on God's love, allow the spirit of God to flow through. I invite you to do this on your own.

Start by saying slowly, 'Be still and know that I am God. (breathe) Be still and know that I am. (breathe) Be still and know. (breathe) Be still. (breathe) Be."

NOW sit for 20 minutes, undisturbed. (Use a timer to avoid watching the clock) Breathe, listen, focus on God's love, get bored, lament if you must, allow God to guide you. If you begin to think about all the "to dos", STOP & focus on your breathing. This is an exercise in leaving your cares and allowing God in.

When your time is up read a lesson from the Bible &/ or start writing a prayer. Keep writing to let God guide you to come to your realization of what God is telling you.

While innovative, it lacked the personal connection that is so essential to ministry. Youth ministry is far more than a 9-to-5 job where you clock in, sit at a desk, and then go home. It's a calling to be present in the lives of young people and their families. Whenever a young person invites me to an event-whether it's a sports game, a fall musical, a graduation, or any other milestone-I see it as my obligation to show up. If a family asks me to celebrate with them, I celebrate. If they need someone to mourn alongside them, I mourn. Wherever I am asked to go, I view it as a call from God.


